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| Public Services | □ Emergency services (blue light services) – the main services are police, fire and rescue and ambulance □ Armed services – includes the British Army, Royal Navy, Royal Air Force, supported by the Territorial Army, Royal Navy Reserves, Royal Air Force Reserves □ Local authorities – includes city councils, town councils, county councils, unitary authorities □ Central government – includes responsibility for transport, education, the environment, health, business and skills, and relations with other countries □ Voluntary/third sector services: □ acting as or providing support for emergency services – including services provided by the Royal National Lifeboat Institution (RNLI), Mountain Rescue, the Royal Voluntary Service, the Red Cross, St John Ambulance □ supporting social services (the National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (NSPCC), Shelter) □ supporting health (the British Heart Foundation, Cancer Research) □ The purpose of each public services group includes: emergency services (blue light services) – to respond quickly and effectively in case of incident, accident or emergency to prevent incidents (crime, public disorder, fire, accident and injury) armed services – to defend the UK to support international peacekeeping duties to support the civil authorities | | | |
